Attributing much of their success to their intimate performances, Lowlands developed their sound in backyards and living rooms, amongst friends and family. Now they are ready to share their sound across Canada's musical landscape.

### The Wooden Sky

Trying to nail down the disparate genres explored by Toronto's Wooden Sky isn't an easy task. When pressed, the band tosses out tags like "folk rock," but the words don't hint at the nuances in their sound. *Every Child A Daughter, Every Moon A Sun* is their third full-length record. Gavin Gardiner, Andrew Wyatt, Simon Walker, Andrew Kekewich and Edwin Huizinga comprise this collective, and their unique influences are apparent throughout the new album, a more spacious yet intimate experience. Noted as one of *Exclaim Magazine's* most anticipated albums of 2012, *Every Child...* sees its release on February 28 via Black Box, followed by a coast-to-coast national tour.

In a few short years, Dan Mangan has gone from globe-trotting folk crooner to one of independent music's most promising storytellers. His critically acclaimed sophomore album, *Nice, Nice, Very Nice*, earned him a Polaris Music Prize shortlist, a spot at Glastonbury and shows with The Walkmen, Decemberists and Okkervil River, to name but a few. *Oh Fortune*, produced by Colin Stewart (Black Mountain, Cave Singers), is bigger and more challenging, though still infused with the signature wit and wisdom that have made Dan such a fan favourite wherever he goes. To be sure, this release marks the arrival of a new voice, with world-class charm and a universal appeal. Oh fortune, indeed.

## Harry Manx

"Mysticssippi" blues man Harry Manx has been called an "essential link" between the music of East and West, creating musical short stories that wed the tradition of the blues with the depth of classical Indian ragas. He has created a unique sound that is hard to forget and deliciously addictive to listen to. Harry forged this distinctive style by studying at the feet of the masters, first as a sound man in the blues clubs of Toronto during his formative years and then under a rigorous five-year tutelage with Vishwa Mohan Bhatt in India. Bhatt is the inventor of the 20-stringed Mohan Veena, which has become Harry's signature instrument.

## Kim Churchill

Kim Churchill's style is unique and explosive, with intricate fingerpicking, percussive beats on the body of the guitar, and two-handed tapping intertwined with an earthy stomp box, powerful harmonica melodies and soulful voice. Though his playing is often complex, his songs have an easy, natural flow that certainly reflect the peace of mind that rolling waves and a rising sun possess. Kim Churchill is a live spectacle and a true virtuoso, but unlike so many others who could be labeled as such, he transmits a vibe of genuine modesty. Perhaps it's his nomadic life on the road or probably his passion for surfing that keeps him grounded.

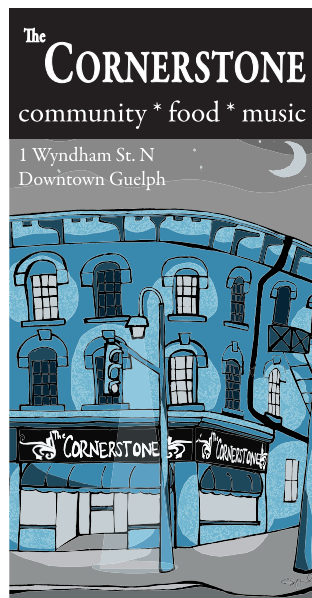

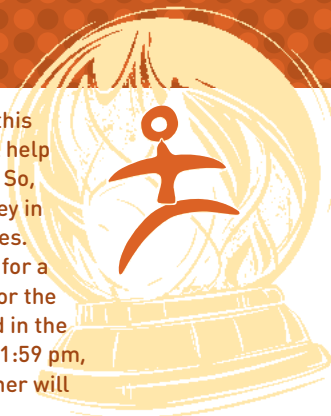

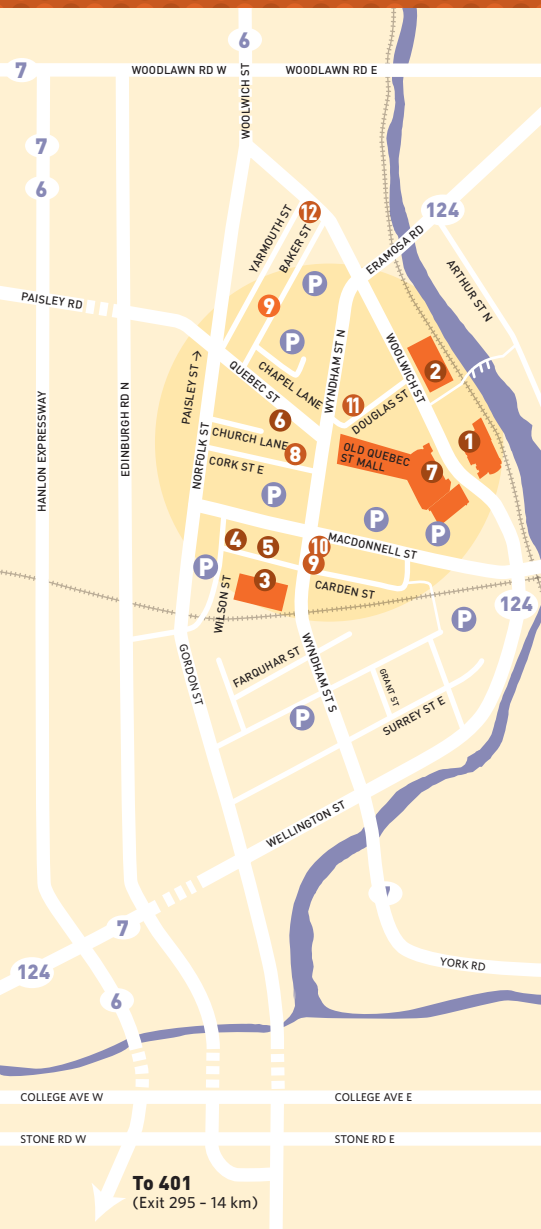
